## THE SCHEDULE

The group shall consist of any individual who holds a licence of any description under the Consumer Credit Act, or who is a member of a partnership holding a licence, or who is a licensee under a group licence, and who is appointed to be:

- i. a liquidator, receiver, or manager, of a body corporate or an unincorporated body of persons.
- ii. an executor, administrator, trustee, receiver, manager or judicial factor of the estate of a deceased person.
- iii. a trustee in bankruptcy or sequestration.
- iv. a person authorised under sections 102 or 103 of the Mental Health Act 1959 to carry on the business of a person becoming a patient under Part VIII of that Act, or a curator bonis or judicial factor appointed for that purpose.
- v. a person authorised in Northern Ireland under sections 15 or 68 of the Lunacy (Ireland) Act 1871 to carry on the business of a person who is of unsound mind or incapable of managing his person or property.
- vi. a trustee under or in pursuance of
  - a. a composition or scheme of arrangement proposed under section 16 of the Bankruptcy Act 1914 and approved by the Court.
  - b. a deed of arrangement registered under the Deeds of Arrangement Act 1914.
  - c. a deed of arrangement produced under section 37 of the Bankruptcy (Scotland) Act 1913 and approved by the Court.
  - d. a voluntary trust deed granted in Scotland for behoof of creditors.
  - e. a deed of arrangement registered in Northern Ireland under the Deeds of Arrangement Act 1887
